DAVENTRY HILL SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

The purpose of school uniform is to set a smart and appropriate tone for learning. Accordingly, students who do not arrive to school in the correct uniform at the beginning of the school day may be sent home.

Parents and students are reminded of uniform regulations via information on the school website, the uniform list and home/school communication. New parents and students sign an agreement to comply with the School uniform policy.

- 1. Class teachers are initially responsible for ensuring that uniform is correct.
- 2. A limited supply of second-hand uniform may be available for emergencies via the pastoral team.
- 3. Limited use is made of school funds/Pupil Premium to assist genuine cases of hardship.
- 4. All Staff are expected to ensure that uniform is worn in all lessons and that outdoor coats are not worn in the buildings.
- 5. Pupils are expected to provide a change of clothes for PE, the content of which is set out below.

Jewellery:	Only 1 small pair of ear studs and 1 small single band ring and a watch are allowed. For safety reasons all jewellery must be removed for PE.	Earrings of any kind, sovereign rings, nose studs, bracelets, necklaces, ankle bracelets, belly button rings or any additional body piercings.
Hair:	Colour must be natural nature or solid color and style must be appropriate for school. No extreme styles or cuts.	Hair dyed multiple unnatural colour, extreme shaven hair or shaven tramlines or patterns in hair of an offensive nature.
Make-Up:	Light makeup may be worn in KS4 and KS5. Nail varnish should be clear or pale.	

All kit and uniform must be clearly marked with owner's name. A bag is essential for carrying clothing, kit and books- book bags and PE bags are available with the school logo.

Buying Uniform

All items of uniform with a logo are for sale via the link on the schools website from Scallywaggs or direct from the shop located on Daventry High Street.

Enforcing the Rules

Confiscate any excess jewellery or unsuitable items and pass them to the office. The office will then create a letter asking parents to collect it.

Provide students with remover and insist they remove any noticeable make-up or coloured nail varnish.

Students wearing high heeled shoes, unsuitable boots or clothes which cannot be confiscated/unacceptable hairstyles should be sent to the Head of School, who will arrange for them to go home and change or be kept out of lessons for the remainder of the day. The only exception to this is when the uniform item has

PE:

suddenly broken/been damaged (when a period of grace is allowed) or the student has an injury which makes their normal uniform unwearable. Such exceptions should be supported by a note from parents.

Positive Reinforcement

The schools Reward Point Scheme, supports the wearing of the correct school uniform. I point is awarded in each lesson (6 per day).

Special Requirements

If any child has a medical or sensory need for an adaption of the uniform the school will make reasonable adjustments after discussion with parents and school pastoral staff- any adjustments will be presented to the Head of School by pastoral staff for agreement, the Head of School will then share this agreement with all staff.
